Classes are in German but students do not need German to participate in the classes. Students complete projects in the above areas and participate in the International Workshop – a group of students and lecturer who meet regularly to discuss work and ideas.

Services

Generally we can provide you with a **room** in an apartment in a student residence. Monthly rent is 250 Euro (Oct. 08)

German students will be »buddies« and will collect you at the airport and take you to your residence. They will help with registration, etc. and help you settle in.

A **social programme** with trips and activities will be organised for the weekends during the semester.

Costs

Students coming from our **partner universities do not have to pay the tuition fees** at Hamburg University of Applied Sciences (HAW Hamburg). All other students will have to pay 375 Euro for the semester.

All students have to pay a semester contribution of 210 Euro (Sept. 08). For this money you will get a **semester ticket** which allows you six months unlimited travel on Hamburg's public transport system (bus, underground)

Students from non EU countries will also have to sign up for the German **health insurance** system. This costs 58 Euro per month.
