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### Vorbereitung (Planung, Organisation, Bewerbung bei der Gasthochschule, etc.)

Preparation: First of all, I had a look into the internet brochure of the HAW and compared all partner universities with each other. I found for me the best possible solution. The Hogeschool Rotterdam in the Netherlands.

Secondly, I started to write all deadlines for application forms in my agenda. Subsequently I followed the procedure on mobility online step-by-step. (There were no bigger difficulties)

Finally, I was accepted in the international exchange program of the Hogeschool Rotterdam and I received the conformation letter for the spring semester 2015.

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Accordingly to the grade curve and the selection of the subjects, everything was pretty structured and clear by itself. The Hogeschool Rotterdam is the partner university of the HAW and the entire courses of the exchange program should be accredited for my courses in Hamburg. There were small differences between the ECTS of the courses and the marks in the Netherlands because of different grading system. Finally, after an appointment with the professor of the relevant department of the HAW everything could be clarified.

### **Unterkunft** (Suche, Mietpreise, Adressen, die bei der Suche helfen, etc.)

The Hogeschool Rotterdam arranged the contracts for the accommodations for international exchange students. Before I left Germany I applied for a free spot in one of four international students accommodations. The price was pretty good (€ 350.- monthly rent for the penthouse view in 13<sup>th</sup> floor in a skyscraper located on University of Rotterdam College). I can recommend everyone to apply for a spot in an international house because the rent is in comparison not really higher. There is no stress or pressure to find a cheap shared flat in the city and the best point is you living in an international environment and it is easier to come in contact with new students and create friendships.

### **Alltag und Freizeit** (Lebenshaltungskosten, Kontoeröffnung, Handyanbieter, Veranstaltungen, Sport- und Kulturangebote, etc.)

The spare time I spent often in the gym or I did biking tours with friends. I think Rotterdam is a beautiful city with many opportunities even for the spare time. From my point of view, it is convenient to have a budget of at least € 1000.- per month to have a good time. The prices in the groceries stores are quite the same in comparison to Germany but you will spend more money in the Dutch supermarkets like AlbertHeijn than in Aldi or LIDL. For my cell phone I bought a Lebara mobile card. You get for €10.- 1 GB internet capacity in a month. Public transportation: Rotterdam has a good connected subway line and also a tram and busses. To travel with the RET you need to buy an OV-card and it is necessary to upload money on this card to pass the barriers to the public transportation. As consequence, a credit card or a Dutch bank account is an obligation to survive in the Netherlands because paying by card is more common than by cash. The best option to be mobile is to buy a second-hand used bike. There plenty of ways to get these e.g. Commodity Market on Facebook, [www.marktplaats.nl](http://www.marktplaats.nl) or you can get a bike for € 6-10.- from the streets supplied by junkies.

### **Fazit**

Go to the Netherlands and than instead of Amsterdam choose Rotterdam and make the time of your life!!!
